We have a couple of new members to join us the first of the month and hopefully we can get a few more next year.

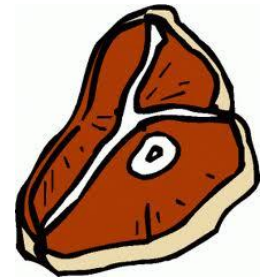
